By exploring different stories from Scripture, students will gain an understanding of the significance and atmosphere of each Church season. Every season highlights unique theological themes that guide us through the narrative of our salvation. The content of the units shapes and develops our students. With their unique talents and expressions of faith, teachers share the Gospel as they pass on religious beliefs. The Grade 2 Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ program integrates seamlessly into the Church's mission that we are all united in Christ.

In Grade 2, your child will discover the six components of catechesis in a suitable and captivating way through five units focused on the liturgical year, featuring the following themes:

Unit 1: We Belong to God's Family

Unit 2: The Road to Bethlehem

Unit 3: Jesus Guides Us

Unit 4: The Story of Lent and Easter

Unit 5: We Are Blessed in Faith

Religious education holds a vital and fundamental role in the culture and life of a Catholic school.
