Each season carries its unique theological focus, guiding us through the narrative of our salvation. The units provide valuable insights for students, while teachers share their faith and utilize their gifts to evangelize. The Grade 8 Growing in Faith, Growing in Christ program complements the Church's mission of evangelization effectively.

In Grade 8, your child will discover the six components of catechesis in a suitable and captivating way through five units focused on the liturgical year, featuring the following themes:

Unit 1: Preparing for God's Kingdom

Unit 2: Bringing Christ into the World

Unit 3: Sacramental Grace for a Life of Service

Unit 4: God's Plan of Salvation

Unit 5: Acting in Virtue and Solidarity
